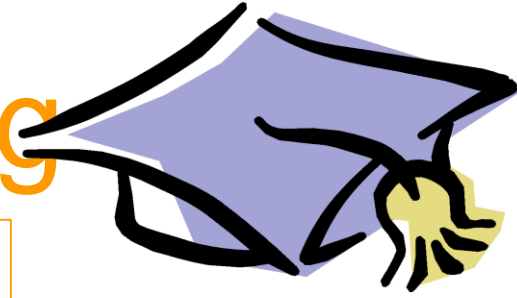

- **Standard Diploma:**
 - 23 total credits
 - EOC & ACT Participation
 - Competencies
- **Advanced Diploma:**
 - 24 total credits
 - EOC & ACT Participation
 - Competencies
 - 3.25 cumulative GPA
- **Honors Diploma - Advanced requirements plus**
 - 3.6 GPA
 - 10 semesters of Honors or AP classes with B or better

**1 PE credit can be waived through participation in sports or marching band

- 2 year community college?
- 4 year university? Take the ACT/SAT.
- Work force? Look into learning a skill.
- Vocational/Technical school? CTE classes, ASVAB

College Bound

- ACT/SAT needed for college placement and by Feb. 1st of senior year for scholarship considerations at most colleges.
- Apply to colleges individually or by the Common Application.
- Visit campuses, make sure it is a good fit.
- Do the math, add up 4 years of tuition, books, room and board, travel expenses, parking, misc.
- Best predictor for success in college is work ethic and taking 4 years of math in high school
- Keep GPA up to 3.0 or higher.

Benefits of Doing Well on the ACT

Millenium Scholarship

- A score of 21 or higher waives the GPA requirement of 3.25 for the Millenium Scholarship
- This is a \$10,000 scholarship towards tuition for Nevada colleges.
 - UNR
 - UNLV
 - WNC
 - TMCC
 - Etc.

UNR

- A score of 22-30 can get you a \$2,500 scholarship if your unweighted GPA is high enough.
- A score of 31-35 with a GPA of 3.5 or higher can get you a scholarship of **\$8,000 per year.**
- A score of 22 will replace the academic GPA requirement of 3.0 for admissions.
- To get placed into freshman courses you need a 21 for English and a 22 for math. Otherwise, you might have to take remedial classes which you will pay for, but will not count towards your degree.

Common Application

- Over 700 schools now use this application (Harvard, Yale, Princeton-use ONLY common application!)
- Schools will not choose their own application over the common app.
- Complete ONE application (Which means fewer essays!)
- Counselors and teachers also complete one form for students.
- The app also has helpful tools that let you track application components, due dates, etc.

UNR /UNLV Admission Requirements

Application deadline for UNR is Feb. 1st.

3.0 Academic GPA

- English 4 yrs
- Math 3 yrs
- Natural Science 3yrs
Including 2 lab sciences
- Social Science 3 yrs
World & US History & Gov't
- If a student doesn't meet the GPA requirement, they may use an SAT Verbal & Math combined score of 1120 or an ACT composite of 22 in place of GPA.

WNC Admission Requirements

- You are eligible to attend WNC if you graduated from high school, or have a G.E.D., or are 18 years old.
- Take placement tests for English/math unless you have recent ACT or SAT scores.
- Attend student orientation.

In-state College Costs (per year)

UNR

- Tuition - \$6217 per/yr
- Books/supplies - \$1300
- Room & Board \$1221
- Misc. fees - \$776.5 (health fee, student union fee, etc. (e.g. parking fee is an additional \$400 per year))

Community College

- Tuition - \$2805 per/yr
- Books - \$950
- Room & Board (if not living with family) \$9220 per year

WNC Bridge To Success

- In the Spring of their Senior Year students will meet with WNC Counselors at DHS to apply WNC.

Steps:

- Apply to WNC
- Take placement test
- Apply for Financial Aid
- Register for WNC classes
- Free tour of WNC
- Attend new student registration

ASVAB Test

Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery

- Most widely used multiple-aptitude test battery in the world
- Measures strengths, weaknesses, and potential for future success
- Provides career information for civilian and military occupations
- Is an indicator for success in future endeavors

WNC JUMPSTART PROGRAM

The Jump Start College program is a dual-enrollment opportunity for students in selected Nevada high schools. Students enroll in college courses through WNC while simultaneously earning high school credits. Jump Start College participants are able to complete up to 60 college credits through WNC.

Students who have met Algebra II grade requirements may be considered. They will complete the college Accuplacer essay test and those who test into English 101 will be eligible to apply for the “Jump Start College” program.

UC/CSU Requirements

- **Complete a specific set of 15 college-prep courses called, “A-G” subjects**
 - **History/Social Science (a) ; 2 years**
 - **English (b) ; 4 years**
 - **mathematics (c) ; 3 years (4 recommended)**
 - **Laboratory Science (d) ; 2 years (3 recommended)**
 - **Language other than English (e) ; 2 years (3 recommed)**
 - **Visual and performing arts(f) ; 1 year**
 - **College-prep elective (g) ; 1 year**

Millennium Scholarship Requirements:

- ❖ Minimum 3.25 GPA or ACT 21/SAT 1070
- ❖ Nevada resident for at least two years of high school
- ❖ Complete all core curriculum classes
- ❖ Must complete 4 years of math including Math 3
- ❖ Must enroll in an eligible Nevada college
- ❖ You don't apply for this, you qualify for it
