Student Safety

Douglas County School District is committed to the safety of all students and staff members. We are constantly reviewing and updating procedures to ensure safety. There are several items that parents and guardians should be aware of in order to help us with our efforts.

- Verify that the school has accurate information in Infinite Campus. This can be done through the Parent Portal (not your student's account). This is how the district and school will communicate with you.
- Check the school website and the district website for updates as they become available. Do not come to the school or call the school as staff will be needed to handle the emergency efforts.
- Rely on information from the school/district and not social media or other unreliable sources.
- Become familiar with the most commonly used terms:
- Stay Put: Threat outside of the school. The buildings are secured and day to day operations continue.
- Lock Down: Threat inside the

school. There will be no admittance or release from the school. Students are put into a safety mode and instruction stops until the threat is cleared. Please be aware that calling or texting your student may disclose the whereabouts of your student in a dangerous situation.


Yearbook
