Special Testing Day Scheduled

Douglas High School will be following a special schedule for testing on Tuesday, March 12. This day will be set aside for all Juniors to take the ACT test that is a part of the graduation reguirement for the state of Nevada. Freshmen, Sophomores, and Seniors who have not been invited by the counseling department will not attend school on this day. If you have any questions concerning the need to attend school on this day, please contact the counseling office at 782-5136, extension 1713 or 1734.

- -Why do you want to take the ACT test?
- 1. Completion of this test is a graduation requirement for Nevada High School students.
- 2. The ACT is an exam accepted by all colleges and universities to make admissions decisions - the better you do the more options you have.
- 3. There are many scholarships offered based on ACT scores the better you do, the more scholarship options and the higher their value.

- 4. Some employers want to see ACT scores to help determine your eligibility for a job.
- 5. The cost of the ACT test taken outside of school is \$67 for the writing section. On March 12, there is no cost to our Douglas High School juniors.
- -How can I prepare and improve my score on the ACT?

Attend the weekly practice sessions offered by our teaching staff.

Two types of sessions will be offered each week

- 1. Practice Tests Full practice ACT administered by a teacher will be offered most Fridays preceding the March 12 exam given to all juniors. At the end of the session, the answers to the exam will be given.
- Students will be able to determine the score earned.
- 2. Test-Taking Strategies and Content Remediation Each week at least one teacher will be available to help students learn strategies for improving on sections of the ACT. Sections of practice tests will be given in these sessions and teachers will work with students to understand their errors and improve their skills.

News from the Nurse

Take time to get a flu vaccine! CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine as the first and most important step in protecting against flu viruses. Even though the flu season is already in full swing, it's not too late to get the flu vaccine to protect yourself and the family! While there are many different flu viruses, a flu

vaccine protects against the viruses that research suggests will be most common. Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations.

Take everyday preventive actions to stop the spread of germs.

Try to avoid close contact with sick people. While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them. If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone for 24 hours without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.) Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub. Avoid touching your eves, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way. Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like the flu.

How does the flu spread? Flu viruses are thought to spread mainly from person to person through droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze, or talk. Flu viruses also may spread when people touch something with flu virus on it and then touch their mouth, eyes, or nose. Many other viruses spread these ways too. People infected with flu may be able to infect others beginning

one day before symptoms develop and up to 5-7 days after becoming sick. That means you may be able to spread the flu to someone else before you know you are sick as well as while you are sick. Young children, those who are severely ill, and those who have severely weakened immune systems may be able to infect others for longer than 5-7 days.

If your child is running a fever of more than 100.0 and/or vomiting or experiencing multiple episodes of diarrhea, please keep him/her at home to decrease the spread of infection. Let's keep Douglas High School healthy!

Note to 10th Grade Parents/Guardians: On March 28 and 29 we will be screening your sophomore student(s) for vision and hearing. These health screenings are mandated by the state of Nevada & NRS and they are conducted in a professional and confidential manner at the high school during their World History classes. Notices are in the mail!


Track & Field
