Scholarship Opportunity

Liberty Utilities is pleased to provide a \$1000 scholarship to a graduating senior from a high school within Liberty Utilities' service territory. Students must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Unweighted GPA of 2.5 or higher
2. Must attend either South Tahoe HS, Portola Jr. Sr. HS, Loyalton HS, North Tahoe HS, Coleville HS, Douglas HS (must be a resident of Alpine County), or Truckee High School (must live within Liberty Utilities' service territory)
3. Must be accepted to an accredited 4-year or 2-year university or college, or an accredited vocational school
4. Must have some community service experience within the community which they reside

Liberty Utilities is committed to a 100% renewable energy future, strong sustainability practices, and a commitment to our environment. As such, we would like our scholarship to go to a student with likeminded values and interests. As part of the application process we ask that students submit a brief essay (350 word max) on the importance of renewable energy, electric transportation, and/or environmental stewardship in their community or in their educational aspirations (see page 2).

Applications must be submitted to the students' high school by the published deadline as required by their scholarship program. Scholarship winners will be selected by high school designees who will consider the student's academic performance, community and school involvement, financial need and any other appropriate information in addition to the required criteria established by Liberty Utilities.

Winners will receive their check once they provide proof of acceptance into an accredited 4-year or 2-year University or College, or an accredited vocational school. If possible, a representative from Liberty Utilities will present the check to the student at an appropriate ceremony as determined by the school.
